President's Corner

Since this past spring the village board has been discussing additional protection for our residents. One of the plans that the Village agreed on was the Flock Safety Surveillance Company.

This is an American company that sells car license plate recognition technology to villages and neighborhood associations. They install cameras on light posts that scan license plates and send instant alerts to the Sherriff's office. When the cameras identify license plates that match those plates with a list of cars stolen or involved in crimes, the Sherriff is notified.

We are one of many Lake County communities to use this latest technology to detect and deter criminal activity. The cameras have been installed on the major streets where vehicles enter and leave our village. A vehicle "fingerprint" will include the license plate, make, model, color and number of times the vehicle has been seen.


Alerts are sent to officers for cars wanted in connection with crimes, stolen vehicles, wanted persons and Amber/Silver alerts for missing persons. Approximately 70% of all crimes involve a vehicle in some way, and this will provide the police another weapon to fight crime.

There will be no facial recognition or personally identifiable resident information. This will also not be tied to any traffic enforcement that we undertake.

We will lease the hardware annually and update as needed. The cameras are solar-powered and connect to the cloud.

Remember that it still takes all of us to be aware of any suspicious activity in our neighborhoods. If you see something, say something. The Village and the Sherriff can use your help.



On June 4, 2023 the Village hosted a...

100 Year Anniversary Of The Village Hall Building

...Formerly Oak Grove School. Thank you to the residents and first responders for making this day a success.

A bit of history behind the current Village of Green Oaks Village Hall. There were many barriers to the early settlement of the area to the east of the Des Plaines River that is today known as Green Oaks. The dense forest had to be cut and the swamps drained in order to begin pioneer farming here.

One of the earliest settlers was Thomas Madden, who bought some land about three miles east of the river in the year 1844. His house stood just about where the Milwaukee Road railroad tracks pass under Buckley Road. At the time, it was called Madden Road which ran from Lake Michigan and was nothing more than a footpath. It was on Madden Road that Thomas Madden donated property for a

new school in 1850. Madden school was used for many years, but in 1919 the Directors realized that they needed a new, more modern school.

Oak Grove School was originally called Madden School, and it was located on St. Mary's Road in Green Oaks.

The first building was a log cabin built in 1850. There were two terms. The summer term, held from May to September, was for the younger children, and the winter term, held from November to March, was for the older children. Back in the day, female teachers earned around \$28 per month while male teachers earned about \$40-50 per month. Some of the first teachers were Lizzie Finney (1883), G.T. Hattley (1886), & J.T. Delaney (1886).


On June 7th, 1919 voters passed the \$10,000 bond for the construction of a new school located on the same site as the original. The board agreed and everything would have gone smoothly had it not been for Mr. Arthur Simpson. Mr. Arthur Simpson (County Superintendent) refused to approve a new school on the site, arguing that the conditions of the grounds were unsanitary. The bond would go before the voters again in 1920 and 1922, with slightly different sites.

As fate would have it, on November 12, 1923 Madden School was moved to a new location at the corner of O'Plaine and Buckley Roads, and its name was changed to Oak Grove School. At that time served as the only school east of the river in Libertyville. A bond for \$15,000 was passed so the new school could be built. Mr. Elmer Beckwith was the first teacher.

When this school became crowded, a new school was built further south on O'Plaine Road. The old Oak Grove school became the Village of Green Oaks Town Hall. Our present day Oak Grove School was opened in 1957. New additions to this latest school were added in 1960, 1964, 1970, 1977, 1990, & 1997.







On September 9, 2023, the Village hosted their 2nd Annual Oaktoberfest at Lambs Farm. The evening was filled with friends and neighbors enjoying fun games, delicious food & refreshments, and live music! Special shout out to the vendors who helped make this event special! Hope to see everyone again at next year's Oaktoberfest!


